

FINANCIAL REVIEW

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE CANADIAN GUERNSEY ASSOCIATION

We have reviewed the Balance sheet and financial statements of the Canadian Guernsey Association as at December 31, 2019. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Canadian Guernsey Association. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our review.

In our opinion these financial statements fairly represent the financial position of the Association as at December 31, 2019 and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for non-profit organizations.

Another year has flown by and it's time for another update from your Guernsey Breed Improvement Committee. The committee consists of Ken Forster, Rob Forster, Jim Eby, Alan Spence and myself with assistance from our Fieldman Russell Gammon.

Last year all the breeds made some adjustments to their LPI formulas. All breeds are now putting more emphasis on fat and less on protein and we also increased our weighting on dairy strength. Our new LPI formula has slightly higher reliability than the previous version and we feel it better reflects the needs of the Guernsey breed. There was discussion last year about the LPI of Guernsey bulls being half that of other breeds. When comparing the LPI formulas of all the breeds it is the constant value that is added to each breeds formula that makes the biggest difference. Upon contacting Brian Van Doormaal of Lactanet about the constant value he said it is adjusted every April and is added to maintain the original scale of LPI so LPI values are comparable over time. He also added that the LPI formulas are not designed for across breed comparisons.

The changes we made to our classification scorecard came into effect mid-2019 and after reviewing the latest classification statistics we did not see any big changes or swings. The defects flagged most often by the classifiers last round include advanced tailhead, coarse pelvis weak crops and toes out front.

The committee is always on the lookout for new bulls either to add to our syndicate program or to import semen from other countries. If you have a bull that you would like us to consider please forward the pedigree to Russell or one of the committee members. Also, if there is a cow family you would like to use a bull from talk to a committee member and we will explore any options available to us.

Lastly I just wanted to remind breeders to take advantage of the resources available to you. Jessie and Russell are our breeds greatest assets and are always willing to help but there is a plethora of online tools available as well. Facebook has become an excellent tool for sharing information for the Guernsey breed. Also, the Canadian Guernsey and CDN websites are great for researching pedigrees, proofs and other inquiries.
