1.0 Call to Order

President Morris Bartlett called the conference call to order at 11:00 a.m. following the Ontario Guernsey AGM.

2.0 Approval of Agenda

The agenda was reviewed.

Paul MacLeod motioned, and Colin Comfort seconded to accept the agenda. All in favor. Motion carried.

3.0 Review of previous Annual General Meeting Minutes

The minutes of the previous annual general meeting held on Friday, March 22, 2019 were reviewed.

Marie McNabb motioned, and Jocelyn Forster seconded to accept the minutes. All in favor. Motion carried.

4.0 Business Arising from the Minutes

5.0 President's Address

Morris Bartlett presented the President's Address as printed in the annual report.

Jim Eby motioned, and Rob Forster seconded to accept the President's report as read. All in favor. Motion carried.

6.0 Administration/Financial Report

 Jessie Weir presented the administration report as printed in the annual report and gave a detailed report of the finances

Scott Gordon motioned, and Paul MacLeod seconded to accept the administration/financial report. All in favor. Motion carried.

7.0 Breed Improvement Committee Report

- Scott Gordon presented the Breed Improvement Committee Report as printed in the annual report.
- Semex will be outright purchasing the Guernsey bull Springhill Jesse James. This will be a great option for the
 breeders, but not so good financially for the association. Semex royalty payment to the syndicate would change from
 15% to 10% for any future agreements. Semex does want direction from the Breed Improvement committee on
 which bulls to purchase.
- Scott also reviewed the breed improvement statistics as printed in the annual report.

Rob Forster motioned, and Jocelyn Forster seconded to accept the Breed Improvement Committee report. All in favor. Motion carried.

8.0 Fieldman Report

- Russell Gammon summarized the report as printed in the annual report.
- Please forward pictures to Russell to use for the Facebook posts as he aims to meet his 366 posts for this year.
- Focus for 2020 will be tracking activity on registrations of animals imported from the US. Morgan Sangster and Natasha McKillop (Holstein Canada Field Service) will be contacted to help with this project. Russell will also work with agriculture communications regarding Guernseys in the agricultural community. Drafting herd profiles on Christian Kaiser, Lindrian Farm, Bruce Fuller & Dillman's was also mentioned with the priority on Christian Kaiser for the upcoming Journal.

Paul MacLeod motioned, and Colin Comfort seconded to accept the Fieldman report. All in favor. Motion carried.

9.0 Amendment to By-Laws 15. Eligibility for Registration

It is proposed Canadian Guernsey Association modify the By-Laws 15. 1. a. ii. as follows:

- 1. General
 - a. Eligible for Registration shall be:
 - i. Females born in Canada that have a minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) purebred Guernsey inheritance.
 - ii. Males with four generations of 100% purebred Guernsey ancestry.

Change to:

- 1. General
 - a. Eligible for Registration shall be:
 - i. Females born in Canada that have a minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) purebred Guernsey inheritance.
 - ii. Males with four generations of 100% purebred Guernsey ancestry. A genotype must be on file for all males for parentage purposes. If there is a trait or recessive identified through testing it would be documented.

Proposed by Scott Gordon, Seconded by Morris Bartlett

Scott Gordon presented the above amendment and indicated it was to keep the purity of the herd book as pure
as possible. No recessives have been noticed yet but if something does happen in the future it will be
reported to the association.

Scott Gordon motioned, and Christian Kaiser seconded to accept the above amendment. 10 in favor, 0 against. Motioned carried.

10.0 Awards

 Morris Bartlett congratulated the production award winners and indicated the awards would be presented at the summer picnic.

11.0 Elections

12.0 New/Other Business

- The Breeder's Cup competition will change for 2020. It will be a virtual contest with 3 on farm pictures forwarded to Russell Gammon. There will be 2 judges (1 Canadian and 1 from elsewhere). The deadline for the pictures will be May 1st. The judges placing will be worth 50% and the public vote would be other 50% of the score for final placing. Animals must be registered in the Canadian herd book and be 75% purity. Classes 1st lactation, 2nd lactation, 3rd lactation & up, heifers up to 12 months and heifers over 12 months. Restrictions of 2 entries per class per herd. Scott Gordon will be providing to Russell a sample of the 3 picture shots for reference for other members. It would be important that the animals be clean but no professional pictures. No clipping of top lines. EastGen, Select and ST could be sponsors for the various classes. Morris Bartlett, Scott Gordon, Jessie Weir & Russell Gammon will work on this project. There was discussion on not having a charge for the contest.
- Brent Clements discussed animals from 7 farms in the US are being trucked shortly to Eric Salonen in Ontario.

- There was discussion on A2 milk being distributed across Canada through Agri-Foods and an agreement with The a2 Milk Company. The a2 Milk Company are trying to shut down farms who are branding and using the wording A2. Members are not receiving support from DFO. Jim Eby indicated Eby Manor's goal is to be 100% A2 by summer and all animals will be tested. Eby Manor will not be branding their bottles but will be using literature to inform. There was a suggestion to list on the bottles, milk from A2 tested animals. Guernseys are primarily A2 and should be promoted as such.
- 13.0 Unfortunately due to the COVID-19 pandemic our guest speaker for today, Tim May was postponed until another time.

Morris Bartlett thanked everyone for participating and asked the board of directors to remain on the telephone line for a short meeting.

14.0 Adjournment

Scott Gordon motioned to adjourn the meeting at 12:16 p.m.

TO: THE MEMBERS OF THE CANADIAN GUERNSEY ASSOCIATION

We have reviewed the balance sheet and financial statements of the Canadian Guernsey Association as of December 31, 2020. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Canadian Guernsey Association. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our review.

In our opinion these financial statements fairly represent the financial position of the Association as of December 31, 2020 and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for non-profit organizations.

Breed Improvement Committee Report - 2020

The breed improvement committee, consisting of Alan Spence, Rob Forster, Ken Forster, Christian Kaiser and myself, did not meet in person during 2020 but we were in contact through email various times throughout the year as issues that needed our attention arose.

Early in the year Holstein Canada made changes to their classification scorecard and asked all other breeds to follow suit because of the software changes required. The Feet and Legs category has been changed to Foot and Mobility. The Foot section contains foot angle and heel depth while Locomotion consists of bone quality, rear leg side and rear view, locomotion, front leg view and thurl placement. The committee attached weights to each category and sub-category that we feel reflect the needs of the Guernsey breed. Holstein Canada will begin to implement the changes in 2021.

The committee also examined the latest classification statistics. Last round there were approximately 90 2-year-olds classified which averaged a final score of 81 points. Major category breakdowns for 2-year-olds include averages of 82 for rump, 80 for mammary, 83 for Dairy Strength and 81 for Feet and Legs. As always, the highest marked defects were advanced tailhead and high tailhead.

Our committee was contacted by Semex and asked our opinion on a couple families as they are looking to expand their Guernsey bull portfolio. It is great to see Semex getting back into the Guernsey breed and with ST genetics increasing their Guernsey semen availability as well as Masterpiece Genetics now available in Canada our semen options are better than they have been in a few years.

There have not been any new developments in the area of Guernsey genomics. The small Guernsey population in Canada does not offer much opportunity to increase the reliability of genomics by itself. If we tested every cow in the country that participates in registration and classification programs, we would increase the proof reliability by 1%. Hopefully, the next World Guernsey Conference will be able to present a global solution for the Guernsey breed and a plan of action to form a world Guernsey genomic database.

Annual Fieldman Report 2020

STEP BY STEP Who could have predicted how the past year would have turned out?

Through all of the trials and confusion and alternatively, heroic efforts and deeply thought-out decisions about the direction of society it has been a good year for the Guernsey breed. Guernsey milk products have gained an even higher reputation in the center of the country. The recent addition of another dairy processing company with a Guernsey line is exciting! Kudos to the Forster family for aligning with The Udderway Artisan Cheese Company, just outside of Hamilton, Ontario as a supplier of wonderful Guernsey milk. There is gold in Guernsey milk and mining full value from that milk is the very best way to utilize it! More high-quality Guernsey cattle migrated north of the border to add to not only numbers but genetic quality to our bovine population.

A new herd was founded in Eastern Ontario based on "importation" from Central and Western Ontario. At their new home farm in Renfrew County a fair number of Guernseys have an opportunity to show their value and profitability in comparison with three other breeds milked in modern facilities. The flame that was lit by the Kaiser family in bringing Guernseys back to Quebec in a big way has turned into a stronger fire. It is incredibly exciting to interact with Jean-Luc Laplante in the eastern part of the province. We suspect that many, if not all, of his local dairy farmer counterparts have never seen a live Guernsey in their region.

We have seen some growth in the Maritime region. Along with a new member, ably assisted by HAC rep Natasha McKillop, more Guernseys will be milking in the high profile Musqie Valley herd in Nova Scotia. The long-established Beaverwood herd in New Brunswick garnered some good press in the regional farm media this past year as well. And in the West we have seen continued interest in the breed, initially in the year in the form of the very small scale "one or two cows for home use". Later in the year we learned of purchase of American embryos by an Alberta dairyman. Then, in the same week, late in the year, we received two calls from Central Manitoba residents looking for a few head each.

We are finding families going back to their roots of Guernsey owning. Morgan Sangster, the Western rep for HAC stands ready to work with anyone that we highlight as a candidate for Guernsey expansion. What the last few years has taught us is that anyone who becomes involved with a serious number of Guernseys in any of the three Prairie provinces and indeed BC, is never going to have a problem if they develop any surplus number of stock-abundant interest will greet anyone with available Guernseys, even those cattle who are not suited for commercial dairying.

In other news we had an active presence on social media, completed the first National Breeders Cup competition with entries from three provinces and a nice spread in the home bases of winning animals and three respected international judges, and saw the Semex Alliance return to buying Guernsey bulls! It has been great to be fully involved in the process of creating a renewed vision for the Dairy Animal Improvement sector along with the other dairy breeds. Our voice is welcomed, respected, and appreciated!

More often these days we hear dairy farmers saying, "one of my goals is to own some Guernseys!" As the profile of Guernsey milk products expands interest in the makes of that milk follows. It was great to see the Eby family and their farm, herd and growing business featured in both French and English editions of Progressive Dairyman! We were more than pleasantly surprised by the high level of interest in the Guernsey sale held in Western Ontario just before Christmas. Some frankly surprising faces showed interest in those cattle. We came away with proof that Guernsey interest is percolating.

By keeping the breed in front of the dairy public in a positive manner as often as possible, talking up the success new owners are having, celebrating every small miracle that appears and having ready access to HAC staff in the west and the east we will be well equipped to grow incrementally.

Thanks to the constant positive inspiration of Brent Clements in the USA, the superlatively great efforts of our radiant Jessie Weir at HQ and an engaged Board of Directors we hold the pen to write our own future. That future can be as bright as we want it to be! Let's make it shine!
